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Time for justice! TIME TO FIGHT!



On 20 August classroom workers will begin to receive postal votes to decide on strike action for job evaluation.

The decision to ballot comes after years of management and government lies and insults. Classroom workers are sick to the back teeth of waiting for justice. No doubt management thought that if they strung us along we would get fed up and accept anything. But this time, no matter what tricks they play and delaying tactics they try to pull, we must stand our ground.

If we do not fight we will not just lose

our pay increase - management will actually be in a position to cut pay in the future.

As we enter the period of the ballot it is essential that every single classroom worker has the facts at their finger tips. For the first time we have a clear pay claim (see page 2 and 3 of this bulletin).

If we win our pay will increase significantly and we will finally have the recognition that we deserve. If we lose we face a future of pay cuts and humiliation.

It is time to fight – vote for action – united we can win.

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WHAT IT'S WORTH TO YOU?

NIPSA classroom workers across Northern Ireland are preparing to defend their pay and terms and conditions. This battle for a just settlement to the job evaluation dispute will be the most important event in the working lives for many of our members. At stake is the pay, terms and conditions we work for and that our families depend on now and in the future.

A ballot for industrial action will begin on Monday 20 August. If the ballot is successful industrial action will begin in the week beginning 24 September.

As part of the preparation for the ballot, NIPSA 517 Classroom Workers Strike Committee is determined to ensure that members are fully informed of all developments. As part of the drive to get information out to members we have produced this information to allow you to make a comparison between your current rate of pay, management's offer and NIPSA's claim. We hope you find it useful.

THE NEXT STEP

NIPSA classroom workers strike committee members from SEELB, BELB, WELB, NEELB and SELB met on Monday 6 August to discuss developments in the job evaluation dispute and the practical arrangements for strike action.

Following extensive debate the meeting decided that the legally required postal vote for strike action will commence on 20 August. Ballots will arrive with members from that date on. The ballot period will last three weeks.

Following the close of the ballot, the NIPSA five Board classroom workers strike committee will meet to consider the outcome of the vote and if the ballot is successful strike action will begin in early September.

The agreed form of strike action is:

A one day strike in the first week,

three days in the second week and all out strike action commencing in the third week.

Obviously the key issue for members now is returning a strong vote for action so that management understand that we are serious.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO NOW

To ensure that all classroom workers are fully informed, before using their vote, organise a meeting for all classroom workers in your school and schools in your area. Phone your area contact number (below) to arrange a venue, time and speaker.

Ask all non union members to join the NIPSA so that we can all be united in the fight for justice for classroom workers
